Responsive Confession of Faith Selected Verses from
Exodus 20, Matthew 22, 23; Galatians 3

Leader: *And God spoke all these words, saying, I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me.*

People: You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.

Leader: *You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.*

People: Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God.

Leader: *Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.*

People: You shall not murder.

Leader: *You shall not commit adultery.*

People: You shall not steal.

Leader: *You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.*

People: You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's.

Leader: *One of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?*

People: And he said to him, You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.

Leader: *This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it:*

People: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

Leader: *So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.*

People: Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law, justice and mercy and faithfulness.

All: Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith.
