Leader: *What is involved in genuine repentance or conversion?*

Leader: *What is the dying-away of the old self?*

People: It is to be genuinely sorry for sin, to hate it more and more, and to run away from it.

Leader: *What is the coming-to-life of the new self?*

People: It is wholehearted joy in God through Christ and a delight to do every kind of good as God wants us to.

Leader: *What do we do that is good?*

People: Only that which arises out of true faith, conforms to God's law, and is done for his glory; and not that which is based on what we think is right or on established human tradition.
